For both the visiting North Harrison Lady Cats' soccer team as well as the host Silver Creek Lady Dragons over the weekend, the Silver Creek' Girls' Soccer Tourney was a tourney experience they would describe as being mixed overall.

North Harrison played in the opening game against Switzerland Count, and after falling behind 3-0 in the second half, they scored two goals just to end up falling short by a 3-2 score.

Neither team managed to muster any offense in the first half, so the game was a scoreless tie at the half.

Switzerland County scored first with 25:20 left in the second half, and scored additional goals at 16:52 and 14:53.

North Harrison managed to tie up the match at 2-2 when Kenzie Fell scored first with 36:55 in the second half. Team mate Shelby Austin scored the Lady Cats' only other goal almost exactly 11 minutes later.

The Lady Dragons went ahead for good with 2:30 in the game when Deziree Cook scored. North Harrison assistant coach Cody Austin thought that too many mistakes in general were to
