Wesley Wednesdays at the Hwy. 150 Campus feature Simply Suppers from 5 to 6:15, and reservations are not needed. Classes and discipleship groups begin at 6:30 p.m.

Palm Sunday, March 24--In addition to regular morning worship services and classes, United Methodist Bishop Michael Coyner of Indianapolis will be the special worship leader at 5 p.m. as he dedicates the new site at the Hwy. 150 Campus. (There will be no service at the Grant Line Campus that evening only.)

Maundy Thursday, March 28--The congregations of Wesley Chapel and Faithpoint United Methodist will unite on Maundy Thursday in a service at Wesley Chapel’s Hwy. 150 Campus at 7 p.m. led by Pastor Tony Alstott. Childcare will be provided.

Good Friday, March 29--The churches again will combine to commemorate Good Friday at a “Service of Darkness” at 7 p.m. at Faithpoint, 6694 Hwy. 150 at Navilleton Rd. in Floyds Knobs led by Pastor George Wasson. Childcare will be provided for infants and those through age 5.

Saturday, March 30--Wesley Chapel will host an Easter Egg Hunt and Lunch for the public--ages 2 through grade 5--at noon at the Hwy. 150 Campus. Hot dogs, chips, and drinks will be provided, along with a Christian puppet show by the Wesley Chapel Puppeteers. Children are asked to bring a basket or bag to use as they collect some of the 3,000 eggs hidden on the rolling property. Adults are invited to bring cameras to take pictures of children with the Easter Bunny
