Borden had a combined time of 89:28 for the top 5.

Brave runners were, sophomore, Julien Magallanes-winner of all grades with a time of 16:13; George Tipker: 17:29 6th place senior; Nathen Magallanes: 17:45 7th place senior; Gavin Tipker: 17:48 6th place junior; Brian McGee: 19:56 31st place senior; David Wright: 20:13 43rd place junior; Will Little: 20:20 43rd place sophomore and Drew McKinley: 21:53 46th place freshman.

In the junior race for the Musketeers, Khalil McDaniel finished in first place with a time of 16:59. Other top 15 medal winners in their respective races were seniors Dalton Jackson and Reid Prindle and sophomores Josh Ratts and Alex Hobson.

"This was great meet for the guys," said Head Coach Mark Olesh. "They have been working really hard and it's starting to pay off. Beating several conference and sectional teams is one of our goals and the results are starting to show this is happening."
