No corrections were made to the letter. Temple explained that in order to get Derby City Amusements to sign a contract, she had to guarantee them exclusive rights to sell corn dogs, funnel cakes and lemon shake-ups. They have also asked the PCBO to pre-sale bracelets for the rides.

Darlene Hall set the deadline for queen contestants for June 23. The entry fee will again be \$60 for each contestant.
