

Floyd Central took a road trip to Meade County Ky. and eventually lost in overtime, but rebounded with a 59-41 home win last Friday against Corydon Central.

Against Corydon, the Highlanders got off to a fast start, claiming a 17-8 lead at the end of one. Helping them in their fast start was Quinton Miller. He poured in seven of his 12 points including a three-pointer.

Corydon kept the deficit there through the second and third quarters, but FC got hot in the fourth to put the game away.

FC outscored the Panthers 20-9 over the final eight minutes.

Jordan Thompson scored six of his 12 points during the run and Nick Bomersbach got five of his 13.
