

?Grandstand events to include beautiful ladies, races, singing and mud at Scott County Fair

Although several events will be held prior to the start of the 2008 Fair, many more are just around the corner with 4-H and Open Shows gearing up for the annual showcase of animals entered in 4-H projects, as well as open classes.

Many look forward to these shows each year, as well as the great fair food that is offered by vendors, special exhibits by businesses and organizations and nightly entertainment scheduled at the grandstand.

This year, the Scott County Fair Board Association has prepared a week filled with events.

The first event at the grandstands that will take place on Sunday, July 13, is the Motorsports Stock Car Races promoted by Terry Eaglin, starting at 7 p.m. Cost is \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

The second event, set for Monday evening, July 14, also promises to be a real crowd-pleaser. The evening will offer the 2008 Little Miss and Master competition, followed by the 2008 Miss Scott County Fair Queen Pageant. The cost this year will be \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under. The evening's program will start at 6 p.m with the Little Miss and Master, followed by the queen contest at 7 p.m. Be there early for a good seat.

On Tuesday night, July 15, the grandstand event will be the Mini-Car and Enduro Race promoted by Ted Smith starting at 7 p.m. Admission will be \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

Fair-goers will enjoy the grandstand event on Wednesday night, July 16, which features the musical group The Robinson Family. Admission will be \$6 for adults and \$4 for children 12 and under.

The grandstand event on Thursday, July 17, will be a The Outlaw Demolition Derby (1979 and older demolition derby) promoted by Tim Collings starting at 7 p.m. Admission is \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

Then, on Friday night, July 18, the main grandstand event will be the Open Demolition Derby (1980 and newer demolition derby) starting at 7 p.m. Admission is \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.

The final night of the Fair will bring the messiest of the events, the ever-popular Mud Bog, starting at 7 p.m. and promoted by Terry Eaglin. Cost is \$8 for adults and \$5 for children 12 and under.
