It was a season to forget for the Scottsburg Warriors as they managed only three wins in Coach Anthony Winchester's first year as head coach. Luckily, the Warriors had the perfect opportunity to do just that as they began the Sectional tournament with a clean slate. After drawing the bye, thus being moved automatically to the second round, the Warriors found themselves playing the Greensburg Pirates, with hopes of making it to the championship game.
