Queen Shelby may have been bowled over by the fact that she earned the title, but the beautiful blonde recovered quickly and walked forward to receive her crown, the traditional bouquet of dark red roses and her sash from 2012 Miss Scott County Fair Queen Nicole Walker.

The new Queen just graduated in June from Scottsburg High School. She is the 18-year-old daughter of Jennifer and Michael Amburgey of Scottsburg. Visitors to Hardy Lake State Recreational Area may enjoy her royal presence since she is working there this summer as a gate attendant.

Queen Shelby was sponsored in the contest by the Scottsburg Lions Club, the same group which sponsored Queen Nicole last year.

Shelby enjoyed her high school career at Scottsburg. Aside from her other classes, she graduated from the school's first EMT-Basic course. By taking one final state exam, she will be a certified Emergency Medical Technician. Shelby was class vice president as a freshman and played volleyball that year. She played four years of softball and served as captain of that team while a senior as well as the school soccer team as a junior and senior. She was a four-year member of the French Club, its vice president as a senior, and the SHS chapter of Sunshine Society. An Academic Honors Diploma graduate in June, she was a National Honor Society member and served on the SHS Prom Court this spring.
