Fair Board members have also spoken with the Ride promoter Fiesta Rides and stated that they will be sitting up and will be operating on the Midway Monday, July 14 through Saturday, July 19, with kiddie day being Wednesday, July 13, from 1 to 4 p.m. and also that evening. Scott County EMS will also be offering free blood pressure checks at its first aid building throughout the fair.

The Scott County Friends of Hardy Lake will also be operating a display and booth at the DNR building as well this year with birds of prey, fish, turtles, frogs, a bald eagle, snakes, and many other mounted animals.
