To date, Relay For Life of Scott County has raised over \$43,000, after expenses, with more to come before the fiscal year ends August 31.

Although an early afternoon downpour and threats of more rain that Friday night dampened the festivities a little, persistent teams continued to set up campsites and started relaying. The evening started with an honorary dinner that celebrated 210 cancer survivors and caregivers.

Following the dinner was the traditional and very touching honor lap at 6 p.m. Even though it continued to rain,

Leadership Development Chairman Beth Niccum stated, "Cancer doesn't take a break when it rains, and the foul weather only made this event more meaningful, because we will continue to fight."
