All booths will open at 5 p.m.

The Festival princess contest sponsored by Phi Beta Psi Sorority will be announced at 6 p.m.

The Festival's emotion-stirring patriotic ceremonies will feature the local VFW Post No. 1083 accompanied by the ladies and men's auxiliary at 6:30 p.m. Crothersville's Most Talented will be center stage at 7 p.m. The talent show will be changed somewhat this year. Everyone is invited to share their talent from musical to comical. The winners will be determined by the people's choice. People will have two ways to vote, text messaging or paper ballots. The cake walk sponsored by the VFW Post No. 1083 ladies auxiliary will be on Preston Street at 7:30 p.m. The Colwell's Gospel Group will close out Thursday evening.
