

## Charlestown preparing to become “Christmas City”, Light Up Charlestown set

While most citizens are preparing their menus for the upcoming Thanksgiving day meal and looking forward to the time spent with family and friends, some have already started planning for the Christmas season.

Many citizens have taken advantage of the present from Mother Nature, the beautiful weather in early November, to begin decorating their yards and homes for the season. While those citizens have taken their hundreds of lights and made beautiful scenes, some working with the City of Charlestown have taken hundreds of thousands of lights to make Charlestown the Christmas City.

“We have 108,800 lights ready right now,” stated Josh Campbell, who is part of the mastermind behind the lighted Christmas show. Campbell, along with Mark Obermiller, have spent some 600 hours thus far, preparing for the city’s big holiday season kick-off, Light Up Charlestown.

Obermiller is locally famous for his extravagant light display at his home in Lexington. Campbell first met Obermiller when he was traveling home from visiting family in Scottsburg and noticed the light display in 2002.

“I stumbled on Mark’s display in 2002. I stopped and seen it. I then went a couple more times in 2002,” Campbell stated.

He continued, “Christmas is my holiday. I have been fascinated with lights since I was a kid. I remember going to Graceland Baptist Church in New Albany as a kid. I have just always been fascinated with lights.”

Obermiller and Campbell have been working diligently on the lights for the display since August. They began this year’s planning with a symposium in Louisville.

“We attended a symposium at the Hyatt Regency in Louisville. It was an all day Christmas lighting seminar. It was great,” Campbell stated.

“It was like seeing everyone that had the same obsession as you,” Obermiller said with a laugh.

This year’s Light Up Charlestown activities will be held on Friday, November 27 beginning at 5 p.m. This is the 10th anniversary of Light Up Charlestown and this year’s theme is “One Community Under God.”

“We have a lot of new things this year. We have churches involved this year. We have events from Light Up all the way to the weekend before Christmas,” stated Charlestown Mayor Bob Hall. “It’s exciting. There are a lot of new things to come and enjoy.”

The core group of planners for the Christmas events in the City of Charlestown have not only planned the biggest and best Light Up Charlestown event in 10 years, they have also planned family-fun events throughout the holiday season.

“We have events planned from Light Up to December 19,”stated Rhonda Davidson, Assistant to the Parks Advisory Board.

The city’s radio station will broadcast all the information needed for the events leading up to Christmas on 87.9.

“Interviews are being done now. We should be ready to go sometime next week,” Davidson stated during the Thursday morning interview. “The radio station and the web site ([www.cityofcharlestown.com](http://www.cityofcharlestown.com)) will be full of all the information they will need for Light Up and the weekends following.”

Light Up Charlestown will be held in Greenway Park the Friday after Thanksgiving. Activities will begin at 5 p.m and continue through 9 p.m.

how they put all this together to give us the beautiful light display. I can't even find the words to describe it," Davidson stated. "The city employees are also working hard to make Light Up memorable for local families. We have volunteers from local churches, the Charlestown Beautification Committee and residents, all working to make this come together. We have some 30 citizens in the community choir who are already rehearsing for the Light Up. They are all amazing."

The schedule of events will have something for every member of the family.

"The Parks Department and Mayor Hall are working to create family memories and affordable family events," Davidson added. "We want families to be able to stay in town and create cherished memories. Our goal is to give something back to the community."

One of the more popular activities during Light Up is the horse drawn carriage rides through the park and Christmas village. The carriage rides will be during Light Up Charlestown on a first-come, first-serve basis. The carriage rides will begin at 5:30 p.m. You may register on the city's website at [www.cityofcharlestown.com](http://www.cityofcharlestown.com) for the rides during Light Up. Registration must be 24 hours prior to the event. The carriage rides will also be held every Friday and Saturday night beginning November 28 through December 19. The cost of the carriage rides will be \$2 per person and children 6 and under will be free.

During Light Up Charlestown, the members of the Charlestown High School Junior Varsity and Varsity Boys Basketball team will also be on hand to help patrons of the carriage rides in and out of the carriage.

Christmas cards are also a large part of local families' Christmas celebration. This year the city will also have Christmas cards, just in a larger format. City officials have designed 4' x 8' wooden Christmas cards to be opened during Light Up Charlestown. The students at Pleasant Ridge Elementary and Jonathan Jennings Elementary Schools have designed ornaments to place on the Christmas cards for display. The children will hand the ornaments as part of the festivities this year.

"After Light Up we will take the cards to the schools to be on display there," Davidson explained.

The Charlestown High School Cheerleaders will be selling delicious baked goods during Light Up Charlestown.

"They still need some \$2,000 more to get to Texas," Davidson explained. "They are leaving for Texas on December 26 to compete in Nationals."

The Charlestown High School Theatre Department will also be selling yummy baked goods during the Light Up Charlestown festivities.

"I hope people will help support both of these groups," Davidson added.

The Charlestown Beautification Committee will be on hand selling hot chocolate and apple cider to help raise funds for the upcoming year.

The concession stand in Greenway Park will also be open during the Light Up Charlestown event.
