The Miss Clark County Pageant originally began in the mid-1940's. The Jaycees hosted the pageant until the Clark County 4-H Corporation took over in 1988.

The pageant has seen some changes over the past 25 years. In 1988 and 1989 the contestants were judged in a swimsuit competition. In 1990 the swimsuit competition was replaced with the active sportswear competition. The active sportswear competition was changed to the professional wear competition in 1994, which is still one of the categories the contestants are judged on today.

The number of contestants vying for the title of Miss Clark County have ranged from eight participants in 1993, 1994 and 2010 to as many as 27 contestants in 2005. Since the 4-H Corporation took over the pageant in 1988, a total of 270 young ladies have competed in the pageant. Some contestants enjoy the experience they gain so much they have chosen to compete more than one year. Of the 270 contestants since 1988, 71 have participated in the pageant more than once.
