Walking into the principal’s office at Charlestown High School, one is immediately struck with a dose of “Pirate Pride.” Earlier this month, the Greater Clark County School Board named Mark Laughner Charlestown High School’s new principal. Laughner comes to Charlestown by way of Jeffersonville’s Parkview Middle School, where he served seven years as principal. Laughner began his teaching career in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida as a social studies teacher, before stints teaching at Clarksville High School and an Assistant Principal position at Clarksville Middle.

Laughner has an athletic history, playing baseball in college, coaching football while teaching in Clarksville, and always enjoying watching student athletes compete. He looks forward to working with the Pirate Pride Booster Club to find ways to bolster school spirit and participation at athletic events. Laughner reiterated his academic focus, and has ideas to help student athletes have the resources needed to take care of business in the classroom; so they can then take care of business on the field or court.
