festivities. After Light Up, Santa will be in his house on the city square to talk to local children every Thursday, Friday and Saturday thru December 21 from 6 to 9 p.m.

During Light Up Charlestown and the remaining nights of family fun, the Concession Stand in Greenway Park will be open selling hot chocolate and hot cider.

After Light Up, the Christmas lights display will be on nightly thru January 3 from 6 to 11 p.m.

Carriage Rides will also be available on Light Up night on a first-come, first-served basis. The first carriage ride on Light Up, Friday, November 29, will leave at 7:20 p.m. Rides will continue to 10 p.m.

Also, during Light Up the Charlestown Middle School Cheer Squad will be hosting s bake sale to raise money for competition and the Charlestown High School Boys Basketball team and Coach Sean Smith will be volunteering/helping during Light Up fort the fifth year.

The concession stand will also be open during the Christmas season selling cold weather favorites. A new offer for the season will be S'mores kits so families will be able to purchase the kits and make their own S'mores to help make lasting family memories.
