The Jeffersonville Arts Alliance recently assembled a community art sculpture inspired by the works of artist Louise Nevelson which is now on display.

The sculpture entitled Creative Essence captures the spirit of Nevelson's work who often experimented with conceptual art using found objects. Local artisans alongside children, teenagers and adults from the community participated in a Jeffersonville Art Movement (JAM) session to create the sculpture.

Dawn Spyker, an arts teacher at River Valley and one of the creators of Jeffersonville Arts Alliance said, "Since the inception of the Jeffersonville Arts Alliance two and half years ago, it has been our mission to promote, encourage and instill appreciation, creation and collaboration of the arts in the city of Jeffersonville and have fun doing it."

The arts are recognized as a tool to aid in patient healing. According to the Society for the Arts in Healthcare, about half of U.S. hospitals are using art to support the well-being of patients, create a healing environment and help with stress and anxiety.
