He also spends considerable time with law enforcement and investigators to find out what really happened, how we could have avoided this tragedy, study what the police did right, and learn what the police could have done different.

Chalmers wants to teach us "Why Today's Teens Kill", "What Motivates Them", and "What Warning Signs", you should be looking for.
