The biggest non-racing event of the season at Salem Speedway is set for Saturday night, June 5th, as the Lucas Oil Pro Pulling League turns the focus from speed to power at the famed racing venue.

The annual classic, which celebrates its 10th anniversary in 2010, has gained a reputation through the years for providing exceptional early-season pulling competition.

Renowned track builder, Dan Cristiani, who has built the track at the National Farm Machinery Show in Louisville for over 25 years, will once again be putting the finishing touches on the 300-ft. pulling surface.

Advance general admission tickets for adults are priced at \$14 each and \$5 for children (age 7-12). Kids, age 6 and under, are admitted free when accompanied by an adult.

Spectator gates open at 5 p.m. on June 5th, and the first pull scheduled for 7 p.m. (EDT).

Pull fans are invited to arrive early and see the powerful pulling machines up close before the start of the pulling action. Due to the current infield construction at Salem Speedway, the pit area for this year's event will be located on the outside of the track in the parking area.

"This will allow fans, both young and old, to get up close and personnel with the competitors and their machines without having to purchase a pit pass," said Deaton.

Pit passes will still be required to enter the track area directly next to the pulling strip.
