The annual Prince and Princess competitions also took place later that day. Every child who entered was a winner, but some stood out from the crowd like Connor Elliot, who was decked out in a full-blown Uncle Sam outfit for the occasion. In the end, Chaylee Byrd was crowned 2012's 4th of July Princess and Reese Wineinger was chosen as this year's Prince. Runners-up were Emma Grace Hart and Lila Jean Blevins, and Anakin McCormick and Alexzander McNally, respectively.
