The chill of fall will soon be in the air, which means Friday Night on the Square is also quickly approaching. The festival will take place on September 14 from 6 to 10 pm. Traffic will be blocked off from the square during this time.

In addition to the various booths that are scattered around the square representing local business and organizations, the Washington County Chamber of Commerce has been working hard to bring some new attractions to the Friday night celebration, and even a few familiar events from past festivals.

The big attraction this year will be a rock climbing wall set up on E. Market Street. The wall is being sponsored by the Washington County Family YMCA and rock climbing enthusiasts of all ages are invited to come test their skills out.

The Chamber will also be bringing back a favorite event from years past, the corn hole tournament. Teams of two will compete for a cash prize. Entry is only \$10 and the tournament is on starting at 7 pm.

The Chamber is partnering with Salem Speedway to bring several prominent ARCA drivers to the square as well. Drivers expected to make an appearance include Frank Kimmel, Chris Buescher, Will Kimmel, Matt Lofton, Frank Kimmel II, Tom Hessert, Spencer Gallagher and Chad Hackenbracht. Buescher and Kimmel are locked in a tight battle for the 2012 ARCA Racing Series championship. You'll have the chance to get their autographs between 6:30 to 7:30 pm. More drivers are expected to be announced closer to September 14.
