

SHS Lady Lions end regular season with a win

The Salem High School girls' basketball team will enter sectional play coming off a 55-43 win over Hauser on Jan. 29.

In that game, six players found their way into the scoring column led by Alex Davidson with 20 points and Brittney Walker added 10.

Treasure Hurst scored nine points and Krista Baker and Sadie Soliday had seven points each. The win over Hauser snapped a five-game losing streak.

Two of the more recent losses were Jan. 24 at Austin and Jan. 19 at home against Paoli. Salem played well in both of those losses.

Against Paoli, Salem battled the highly ranked Lady Rams of Paoli.

Paoli took an early lead, going on top by 13 at intermission, 25-12.

Salem got the hot hand in the third quarter, putting up 20 points.

Alex Davidson scored seven of her 22 points during the run. Danielle Voyles hit two threes and Krista Baker scored five of her 10 points.

In the end, the Lady Rams were too much for the Lady Lions.

At Austin, Salem trailed 17-6 at the end of the first quarter and 28-15 at the half.

The Lady Lions made a run in the third quarter.

On defense, they held the Lady Eagles to just seven point and scored 16 thanks to Alex Davidson scoring 12 of her team-high 23 points. She was also two for two at the charity stripe.

Thanks to Davidson's out-put, Salem trimmed Austin's lead to just four, 35-31 at the end of the third quarter.

Salem kept the score close thanks to three-point baskets from Krista Baker and Brittney Walker and Danielle Voyles scoring sight of her 11 points.

The Lady Lions had 21 turnover.
