

To most adults a dictionary is nothing to get excited about. That is not the case when Washington County SOAR! visited all the third grade classrooms in the county to distribute free dictionaries to each student. As part of the National Dictionary Project, SOAR! requested sponsors from the community to help purchase the dictionaries....all 350! Representatives of SOAR! then visited each classroom and presented a short dictionary lesson. Aside from teaching the basics of the dictionary, the representatives also helped the students explore the other features that make these dictionaries special.

The front of the book is dedicated to definitions, traditional words, and pronunciations; the back of the book is more of an almanac. The representatives show the students how to use the multiplication table and look up a map of the world as well as a map out of this world. The students discover the longest word in the English language, which is the students' favorite part of the lesson.

This year, SOAR! representatives were made up of tutors, volunteers and a board member. Representatives were tutors Anita Sturgeon, Ken Powell, and Stephanie Martin, volunteer, Stephanie Rockey and board member, Alice Nevels.
