Eastern

After coming out flat in their pre-season scrimmage last Friday against Tell City, the Musketeers played toe-to-toe against the visiting Marksman.

In the game, Tell City scored six touchdowns, while Eastern put five on the board.

In the JV matchup between the two schools, Eastern scored five touchdowns to Tell City's one.

Eastern also did something that has been lacking since they became a varsity program in 2007, which was defend the pass.

The Tell Cith quarterbacks struggled all night to find an open receiver.
